
Dear Chief Information Officer Annette Dunn and Review Committee:

I am writing this letter on behalf of FMTC – I35, dba OmniTel Communications (OmniTel). As a resident of New Virginia, Iowa, we would like to express our full support of the Empower Rural Iowa Broadband Grant application for OmniTel. They have a long and successful history of providing state-of-art communications services within the State of Iowa. OmniTel has a strong reputation for community commitment and strong customer service. We are confident in OmniTel's capabilities for enhancing broadband service for those residing in rural New Virginia.

With the assistance from the broadband grant, OmniTel will be able to enhance our broadband connectivity with a fiber network design. This fiber build will enable us to overcome some geographical distances, empower us through information, and bring the world to us through a few simple strokes of a keyboard. As an unserved rural area with limited access to Internet services, we face many challenges including limited medical resources and distance between patients, physicians, specialists and facilities. Because of the rural nature of our area, our students do not receive equitable broadband resources as other students in more urban learning centers. We lack to ability to engage in distance learning, video and other tools that advanced broadband can bring to our students. Therefore, it is extremely important that broadband grant funding be obtained to provision for much needed broadband service to our area.
