- Conclusions regarding broadband deficiencies and their impacts referred to in the recently received Johnson County Broadband Study, particularly for the topics of emphasis (work, education, and remote health) are pertinent to the ITQ responses for the geographic areas being applied for;
- Population density and topography inhibit new broadband investments where providers, as reported to the Board in that study, have communicated a need for public investment for it to be financially viable; and
- Johnson County is actively facilitating increased communication about broadband deficiencies and new investment opportunities with providers in the county, so that they can viably extend services to the areas being applied for, as public funding becomes available.

**RESOLUTION NO. 03-23-23-02****RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FOR BROADBAND INTERVENTION ZONE  
STATUS FOR CERTAIN COMMUNITIES IN JOHNSON COUNTY, IOWA**

**WHEREAS** the term “Broadband” is minimally defined as “the transmission of wide bandwidth data to a particular address location at 100 megabits per second download and 20 megabits per second upload service or faster”; and

**WHEREAS** Johnson County has a goal for each premise in the county to have access to 100 megabits per second upload and download service; and

**WHEREAS** Johnson County, Iowa (“Johnson County”) has identified addressing Broadband deficiencies as a matter of public interest as evidenced by commissioning and receiving a countywide Broadband Study (“JC Broadband Study”) to determine current Broadband access gaps, areas where providers are likely to extend services, and where gaps will persist due to barriers limiting future Broadband investments; and

**WHEREAS** the JC Broadband Study contained analysis of a Market Assessment of provider-reported Broadband services and speeds, responses by key stakeholders at meetings, FCC mapping data, State of Iowa Broadband grant eligibility maps, and provider input to verify the existence of Underserved Locations and Unserved Locations (“Locations”), as defined by the State of Iowa Office of the Chief Information Officer (“OCIO”) in its Invitation to Qualify for Broadband Intervention Zoned application (“ITQ Application”);

**WHEREAS** the ITQ Application defines “Communities” as “a gathering of individuals representing households, schools, and/or businesses in a particular area in the State of Iowa with a shared interest in eliminating Unserved or Underserved Locations within a Geographic Area of Concern”, with increased priority given to Communities demonstrating support from its leaders; and

**WHEREAS** Johnson County has identified three separate Communities of Underserved and Unserved Locations within Johnson County that are resulting in economic, education, and health access disparities described in the JC Broadband Study for consideration by the OCIO for designation as a Geographic Area of Concern; and

**WHEREAS** these Communities have unique degrees of historically disadvantaged populations for which special emphasis should be afforded under relevant federal programs; and

**WHEREAS** these Communities are served by or have locations of Johnson County schools, hospitals, and correctional institutions.


**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Johnson County Board of Supervisors (“Board”) that:

1. The Board supports submitting Invitation to Qualify applications to qualify the following Communities to each be designated as a Geographic Area of Concern by the State of Iowa OCIO, as a matter of public interest:
  - a. SW Kansas Avenue Community
  - b. Rural Hills and Lone Tree Areas
  - c. Rural Area Between Iowa City and West Branch; and
2. Conclusions detailed in the JC Broadband Study prescribe that Broadband-related impediments exist within these Communities to directly engage in work, education, and health care that resulted from or were made apparent or exacerbated by the COVID-19 public health emergency due to lack of broadband access, as evidenced by provider-reported service and speed availability at their Location, and also in Location maps provided by the OCIO; and
3. The JC Broadband Study reports that the lack of Broadband investments in Johnson County to serve these Communities is primarily due to lack of adequate population density per square mile and challenging topography, which together increase the cost per subscriber to construct and operate Broadband service beyond any subscription revenue that could be collected; and
4. These Communities’ members’ engagement in employment, search for employment, and/or development of the requisite skills and knowledge to become employed are impeded by lack of Broadband investments in these areas of Johnson County, as identified by key stakeholders and reported in the JC Broadband Study; and
5. Broadband investments in these Communities, once designated as Geographic Areas of Concern, will help facilitate educational activities at Underserved and Unserved Locations as part of a person’s participation in school, academic programs, or social-emotional development programs for students or youths, improve internship opportunities, increase professional development program participation, and provide other educational experiences not otherwise afforded to the people at these Locations; and
6. Broadband investments in these Communities, once designated as a Geographic Area of Concern, will help facilitate health monitoring services to monitor an individual’s health, including with respect to either physical or behavioral health; and
7. The Board, as being direct representatives of those at Underserved and Unserved Locations within Johnson County, hereby supports these Johnson County

- Communities, as geographically defined in ITQ Applications to be filed, for future Broadband investment as proposed Geographic Areas of Concern; and
8. Johnson County endeavors in a non-binding, streamlined manner and in good faith to provide or coordinate efforts to directly support construction of Broadband infrastructure projects that accelerate Broadband investment, and which may include but are not limited to:
    - a. Use of public Rights of Way ("ROW") where applicable.
    - b. Streamlined ROW permitting for Broadband investments serving groups of Locations.
    - c. Increased County staff time and support to coordinate with providers on grant and other funding opportunities.
    - d. Fostering private economic development investments and partnerships, including in-kind use of multiple Community members' facilities (such as putting communication infrastructure on private property).






