

Expanded broadband will assist area residents with higher broadband speeds and reliable access to internet services.

Carroll County Secondary Roads will assist local underground contractors in the future installation of fiber optic lines by windrowing gravel/rock materials from the edge of the secondary routes for easier access to plow, bore, and install fiber lines. They will also be waiving any permit fees as an in-kind service.
