We rely on Internet at the Dysart Golf course for several different things.

1. Credit Card Machine

Most of our daily transactions are now completed via the credit card machine. We use a dedicated line for the transmission of those transactions. Even with the dedicated line transactions sometimes take a long time to process or sometimes do not process the first time. This is very time consuming for both the employee and the customer. Having the more reliable fiber would give us more consistency with our transactions. Our online settlements from the receiving bank sometimes do not come through, which causes a problem with itemizing the categories of sales for our daily bookwork. We are hoping the fiber will help with that also.

2. Members and Employees access the online weather reports and radar. This is very important when we have people on the course with a weather event approaching faster than we expected or unexpectedly, and we need to get everyone off the course.

3. We do have music for members and we rely on Bluetooth to connect to the speakers. This is very important if it is an event the members have paid for and are expecting music as part of the event. Fiber would make this a more reliable media.



I will begin by saying that I have been an educator for 34 years. I grew up on a farm in rural Iowa and continue to live on a working farm. I have seen the tremendous change in technology over the years and its importance in both farming and education.

**For the past two years, I have been teaching using the internet from my rural farm home.** I taught Special Education Preschool, Preschool, and Special Education first-grade students using my farm internet for two local school districts. To teach these students remotely, I needed to connect with them over Zoom and use a document camera. The students would meet with me for an hour or half an hour depending on the students' needs. These students were too young to use the technology independently, so an adult was taking time out of their day to meet with us.

I faced challenges almost daily over the past two years while teaching students over the internet:

- Since I was working from home, I had to rely on my home network connection. If it was slow or not working that day, I could not do my job.
- Some days I tried to use my phone and disconnected it from my home wifi. Then I could not use my document camera and show my students what I needed to show them. These were young students. They needed to see what I was talking about to do what they needed to do.
- There were times when I was disconnected two and three times during a lesson. When this happened, my student was losing learning time. I had a tight schedule because I had several students to meet with per day. I could not extend my time because of a poor internet connection. Therefore that student lost learning time that day. It was also very frustrating for the adult on the other end to have to keep logging back in.
- Other days we couldn't understand what the other one was saying because of a poor internet connection. This type of thing happened most often with a student who was also on the fctc.coop line.
- I would also have to shut off the wifi on all of my other devices in my home before I started teaching that day. I did this hoping it would help me with my wifi connection. I don't know if it helped at all.

The troubles with technology continued over the two years almost daily. After teaching 3, 4, and 6-year-olds for four hours straight, I was exhausted from keeping things going and supporting the students engaged despite the technical problems. I have always said when technology works, it's great. Unfortunately, my wifi is sadly lacking, as it is for many of our rural students. We need to get good high-speed network access to all of our families. Technology is necessary all of the time. It became more evident than ever this last year during the pandemic. We had students in our district that didn't have access to any internet. During the previous year, how was a student to learn without internet access?

Schools are now providing one-to-one device access. Students are doing most of their work on the device and turning it in electronically. They need access to the internet at home to complete assignments. We have to do something to change this dynamic for our at-risk students! We are leaving behind those students that are already at risk for other social-economic reasons. Providing quality internet access to everyone, whether they live in the city or rural Iowa, is crucial as the role of technology continues to grow.

Dear Chief Information Officer and Review Committee:

I am writing with regard to the lack of availability of internet in our rural area outside of Dysart, IA. At this time there is not a provider option available for this to our home residence.

I am employed by the University of Iowa Hospital and Clinics and work remotely from my home office. If I were to travel each day to the office it would be approximately 120+ miles per day as well as parking fees, etc. This option would not be financially beneficial to maintain my current position.

It is a requirement for working remotely that I have a stable, secure, reliable connection. While the current DSL option I have available to me barely works; it is not always reliable and certainly not fast enough. As well, my employer is pushing for all of us to be on a secure fiber network in the future, we are not allowed to use a fixed wireless connection due to the sensitivity of the nature of work we do.

It is my concern that without the option of fiber optics in my area I will lose my ability to continue work remotely.
