The City of Manning is aware that Manning Municipal Utilities is making application to the OCIO for grant funds available by Empower Rural Iowa Broadband Grant program. As Mayor of Manning, I recognize that our rural community is seeking reliable, fast fiber broadband.

Manning is in the middle of four counties—Carroll, Crawford, Audubon, and Shelby--and Manning businesses serve many rural residents and benefit from those residents as well. We know there are portions of our surrounding rural areas where residents and businesses struggle to receive reliable, fast broadband and as a result are disadvantaged in education, business, health care, government and e-commerce because of the lack of quality high-speed broadband service.

We support the application of Manning Municipal Utilities to connect our rural residents and businesses to high speed broadband via fiber and know that the approximate locations they are seeking to serve with the 92 miles of fiber would be positively impacted by this construction.

As more citizens seek to leave overcrowded metropolitan districts for a quieter rural way of life, we would like citizens and businesses to consider our area as their new home. With the addition of fiber broadband to these rural locations the move becomes even more appealing as work from home and school from home become a reality.

We ask that the OCIO strongly consider the application from Manning Municipal Utilities in order to finance this aggressive rural fiber project.


To Whom it May Concern:


